

Angel Oak Academy Sports Impact Report 2015-16

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided £150 million per year for the academic years 2013 / 2014, 2014 / 2015 and 2015 / 2016 to increase funding for school sports. The funding has been jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money goes directly to Headteachers to enable them to improve the quality of PE and sport for all children. Each school receives £8,000 plus £5 per pupil in years 1 to 6. At Angel Oak Academy we received £9,430 in 2015/16. Schools must spend this on improving their sports and PE provision, but can choose how to do this.

Our main objectives:

At Angel Oak Academy we aim to provide a range of sporting opportunities for our children. Our aspiration is to provide high quality sports education for all of our students, improving their health and fitness and promoting an inclusive ethos, where all students enjoy participating in sporting activities. We provide a wide range of sporting activities to students, including competitive sports events, and have specialist staff who support us in delivering this provision. Angel Oak Academy employs two full-time qualified PE coaches to deliver sports and PE lessons across the academy and ensure that all staff receive pedagogical and sport specific training. Coaches run all sports clubs and arrange and attend all sports fixtures. Coaches also deliver training across the Academy Trust.

Our Sports Grant was used to:

- Project a positive image of the Academy when competing against other schools. Focussing on team spirit, good sportsmanship and positivity.
- Ensure that equipment is safe, practical, usable and in a good condition.
- Participate in competitions within our local area and within STEP Academy Trust.
- Introduce new forms of sport/exercise.
- Identify pupils that will benefit from sport to manage their emotions (Boxercise, Yoga).
- Ensure every child has the opportunity to take part in a sporting activity/PE and not accepting pupils not having a PE kit as an excuse not to take part.
- Provide an opportunity to showcase our sporting talents to our parents and staff (Sports Day).
- Provide Lunchtime-, Before- and After School Clubs
- Develop the practice of current teachers in the teaching of PE and healthy lifestyles

This year, Angel Oak Academy achieved the Silver School Games Mark award for our commitment to, engagement in and delivery of competitive school sport in 2015 – 2016.



Impact Statement 2015/16	
Curriculum	
<p>In 2015/16 Angel oak Academy employed 2 PE and Sports Coaches to deliver a PE curriculum and to model PE lessons to all teachers. Every child in Reception to Year 6 received 2 hours of PE lessons each week. Spare PE kits were made available to PPG families and to those pupils who may have forgotten their PE kit at home. This ensured that all our pupils were included in PE sessions. A PE curriculum which includes complete, whole-school schemes of work for Gymnastics, Dance, Games, Athletics and Outdoor and Adventurous Activities for Primary Schools have been implemented and as such our pupils are exposed to a number of activities that they wouldn't normally have access to.</p>	
Clubs	
<p>The range of before, after school and lunchtime activities available to pupils across the Academy increased last year. Sporting activities were available for pupils from Reception to Year 6, and included: Yoga, Boxercise, Gymnastics, Football (boys' and girls' teams), Netball, Cricket, Dance and Athletics.</p>	
Competitions	
<p>At the end of each academic year, we host a Sports Day for KS1 and KS2 respectively to showcase our talents to our parents and the community. During these Sport Days we have the use of Burgess Park and the PE and Sports Coaches manage the whole day with a round-robin of sporting activities, prizes and a whole lot of fun! This improves community cohesion and parental engagement.</p> <p>Throughout the year, Key Stage 2 pupils had the chance to participate in a number of inter-school competitions, including football, cricket and athletics as part of the London PE and School Sports Network. This comprehensive competition calendar is designed to encourage schools to actively participate in a wide range of inclusive events.</p>
